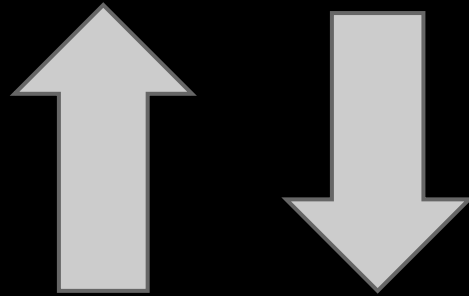

Cyber bullying

Steps To Respect Definition of Bullying:

Bullying is unfair and one-sided. It happens when someone keeps hurting, frightening, threatening, or leaving someone out on purpose.

What is Cyber-Bullying?

Sending or posting harmful material or engaging in other forms of social aggression using the Internet or other technology.

Steps to Respect

"The 3 R's of Bullying:"

Recognize: Is it fair? Does it keep happening?
How does it feel?

Refuse: Label the behavior. Say no in some
way. Walk away calmly.

Report: Tell a trusted adult, especially if you do
not feel safe.

RECORD: Don't delete the evidence.
