Crest View Important Information:

HALLOWEEN SAFETY TIPS: for Students

- 1. Never trick-or-treat alone. Stay in familiar neighborhoods and stop only at well-lit homes.*
- 2. Never enter a stranger's home, accept treats only at the doorway.*
- 3. Carry a flashlight as part of your costume, it will light the way and help you to be seen.*
- 4. After returning from trick-or-treating, make sure*
- 5. that an adult checks your treats. Throw out anything that is suspicious.*
- 6. Make sure you eat dinner before going out trick-or-treating, this will fill you up and you will be less tempted to eat their treats.*
- 7. Avoid wearing long costumes, high heels and anything else that will create a tripping hazard.*
- 8. Make-up is safer than a mask, which can block breathing and vision.*
- 8. Use bright colored fabrics or reflective top for your-costume.*



Nurse Notes:

When Should Students Stay Home?

When students aren't feeling well, it is important to know when they should stay home from school.

- Fever of 100.0 or higher
- Vomiting or diarrhea within in the last 24 hours
- Any contagious diseases or rashes until treatment has begun (please see the Parent Handbook)
- Strep throat within the last 24 hours of diagnosis
- Untreated head lice
- Any ailment that would keep them from fully participating in classroom activities



Report any of the following diagnoses to the school. This would include strep throat, pink eye, pertussis (whooping cough), ring worm, head lice and influenza.
