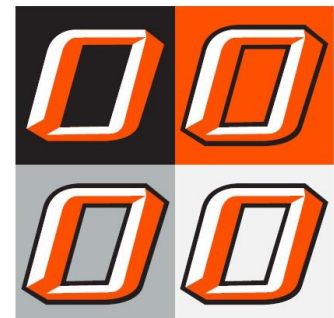
We invite you to join us to meet with your student's teachers during our second trimester conferences. Teachers will talk to you about your student's progress and answer your questions during a five minute meeting. The conference time does not allow for a lengthy discussion of problems. We suggest you arrange to meet with your student's teachers at another time to meet to resolve larger issues.

TIPS FOR PREPARING FOR CONFERENCES:

- Discuss with your student how they perceive they are progressing in class.
- Review classroom objectives and goals.
- Review completed assignments.
- Ask your student if they have any concerns about the class work or teacher expectations.
- Be prepared to share information with the teacher that will assist him/her in working with your student.

Midtri reports will be available through ParentVUE and StudentVUE before conferences on Thursday, January 31. Please go over it with your student. The information is completely online so it is up to date. This system allows teachers to provide the most current midterm information available. It also allows you to see and discuss your student's information prior to coming to conferences.

Are you planning on a career after high school that requires training?
**If you are planning on a technical, community, 2- or 4-year college,
you may be eligible for financial aid!**

The FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) was available on October 1, 2018.
You will want to create an account and complete the application by February 1, 2019.

**All students who will attend college (any after high school training)
next fall should complete the FAFSA.**

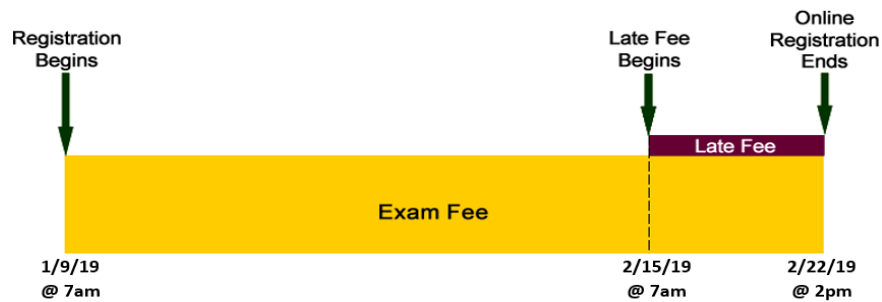
ADVANCED PLACEMENT EXAM REGISTRATION BEGINS JANUARY 9, 2019

ADVANCED PLACEMENT TESTING AT OSH MAY 6-17, 2019

Students wishing to take Advanced Placement exams at Osseo Senior High School may begin registering for those exams on January 9 at 7:00am. Registration must be completed online at www.totalregistration.net/AP/241930. Although registration ends on February 22, 2019, there will be a \$20 late fee per exam for registrations received after February 15, 2019 at 7am.

NO LATE REGISTRATIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED. Please mark your calendars with these important dates.

The Advanced Placement (AP) program is an opportunity for high school students to participate in college-level classes. OSH currently offers AP courses in Art History, Drawing, 2D Design, Biology, Chemistry, Physics 1, Calculus, Statistics, English, US History, Government & Politics, Economics, Psychology, World History, Spanish and French. These classes contain rigorous, college-level curriculum and learning experiences. A college or university may grant credit and/or advanced placement to students who earn a qualifying score on AP exams (usually a 3, 4 or 5). Each college/university uses its own standard to grant credit or advanced placement, so it is extremely important that students check with the specific institution to determine its guidelines. The College Board, creators of Advanced Placement, recently announced significant changes to the AP exam ordering process, deadlines, late fees and cancellation fees that will be mandated for all schools and all students in the 2019-2020 school year.

Next year, all students will decide whether or not to take exams and order their exams by Nov 15, 2019. All students in 1st trimester or yearlong AP classes who register for an exam after Nov 15, 2019, will be assessed \$40.00/exam late fee. In addition, a \$40.00/exam cancellation fee will be assessed for any exam order canceled after Nov 15, 2019. The exam ordering deadline for second/third trimester only courses will be March 13, 2020. It is important that all families are aware of these looming changes, especially as students begin registering for their 2019-2020 courses. We understand that these changes may cause concern for students, parents and teachers. Please keep in mind that these changes are being mandated by the College Board and were not decided by the school.

Additional details regarding the College Board's new process will be made available once we have more information.

ACT AND SAT TEST DATES 2018/2019

The ACT and SAT achievement tests are offered several times throughout the school year.

ALL juniors in the state of Minnesota are eligible to take the ACT at their high school on Tuesday, April 2, 2019. This exam is free of charge.

Junior students are encouraged to take the ACT test at least once at some point during the year (most juniors take the ACT test in February, April, June or July). Students may take the test as many times as they'd like. WHAT IS PSEO?

Postsecondary Enrollment Options (PSEO) - The PSEO program is a dual credit program that allows high school students to simultaneously earn high school and college credit through enrollment in and successful completion of college-level courses on a college campus or online. Students may take PSEO courses on a full or part-time basis. The PSEO program provides students with a greater variety of class offerings as well as the opportunity to pursue more challenging coursework that may be available at the high school. The tuition, fees and required textbooks are at no cost to the student.

Any student who is eligible and wishes to participate in the PSEO program for the 2019-2020 school year must: meet the college's application deadlines, meet the college's admission requirements, and **must notify their assigned Osseo Senior High School counselor by May 31, 2019** of their intent to participate in the program. All interested students should attend one large group information meeting (listed above) and then meet individually with their assigned counselor. Steps to Complete Registration for 2019-20:

Step 1: January 9

Students will learn about registration during their Advisory on Wednesday, January 9

Materials will be sent home with students at this time that will help them make the best course selection choices. These materials are also available on the Osseo Senior High website.

- Registration Planning Sheet
- Four Year Plan Worksheet
- FAQ and Resource Flier

Step 2:

Think about your interests, options and ideas for their 2019-2020 courses. Review the materials provided for additional information and start recording your student's course selections on the Registration Planning Sheet.

Step 3: January 14 - 18

We will continue to work on registration activities through Advisory and Zero Hour (9th/10th). Counseling staff will be available during Zero Hour and lunches in the Career Resource Center to answer registration questions the week of January 14 - 18.

Step 4:

There is an opportunity to access additional information and resources in making registration choices by attending our High School Preview Night, “Success by Design,” on Wednesday, January 23 from 3:00 - 7:00 PM. This event will provide a chance to visit with teachers about specific courses and to gather additional information about course levels (HP/AP), elective programs, and to access more in-depth registration support from counselors and teaching staff.

Step 5:

You will enter your course selections through your StudentVUE portal. This is the system you access your grades, attendance and other important school information. Additional instructions will be delivered through Advisory. This step must be completed by January 31 at 2:00 PM.

REGISTRATION for 2019/2020

Incoming 9th graders - Class of 2023

“Success by Design”

We are so excited to welcome you and your student to Osseo Senior High School! Your involvement in supporting your student through the registration process is very important and appreciated by high school staff. Your student will be starting the registration process in their Advisory in mid-January. School Counseling staff will then be visiting each middle school to support the registration process for your student. Below is an outline of steps intended to provide you with a general roadmap of registering for high school courses.

Steps to Complete Registration for 2019-20:

Step 1: Advisory in mid January

Your student will watch a video about the registration process and things to consider in choosing courses. Registration materials will come home with your student on this day with additional instructions.

Step 2:

Begin talking with your student about their interests, options and ideas for their 2019-2020 courses.

Step 3:

Osseo Senior High counselors and a group of our student leaders will be at your student's middle school (NVMS: Tuesday, January 15; OMS: Wednesday, January 16; MGMS: Thursday, January 17; BMS: date still to be determined) to present additional information about Osseo Senior High School (daily schedule, activities, Advisory, leadership, etc.) and to answer questions and assist your student in completing the course selection process for the 2019-2020 school year. Students will have the opportunity to begin entering their course selections into the registration system through StudentVUE. The final date for entering course selections into the registration system is Thursday, January 31. If your student's course selections are not entered by this date your student will be registered based on the information they provided on the high school registration day at their middle school.

Step 4:

Families will have an opportunity to access additional information and resources in making their registration choices. Our High School Preview Night, “Success by Design”, on Wednesday, January 23 from 3:00 to 7:00 PM provides an opportunity to learn more about course levels (HP/AP), elective programs, and to access more in-depth registration support from counselors and teaching staff. This is also an opportunity for families to visit Osseo Senior High and learn more about academic programs and pathways, achievement and support.

We look forward to meeting your student when we visit their middle school and providing support in the transition to high school. Please feel free to contact us now or in the future with questions. Contact information for the OSH counseling staff can be found on the OSH website and in your student's registration materials.

Attend High School Preview Night on Wednesday, January 23 to ask questions and gather information I need to make final course decisions. Conference details are included in the information I will receive in my Advisory.
If I do not finalize my courses through StudentVUE by January 31 I will be registered based on the courses I chose on the high school registration day at my middle school.

SENIOR INFORMATION

GRADUATION FLIER

A special Graduation Flier is given to each of our seniors during an Advisory in May. This contains a great deal of specific graduation information. For your planning, this year's graduation ceremony is Saturday, June 8 at 4:30 PM at Mariucci Arena. All seniors who complete their graduation requirements on time are encouraged to participate in the graduation ceremony. They must complete all the credit requirements (64 trimester credits), and all Advisory requirements. All fines and fees must also be cleared and detention time served.

CAP & GOWN ORDERING

Osseo Senior High provides a cap, gown and tassel at no cost to all students who participate in the Osseo commencement ceremony. All OSH seniors will order their cap & gown and diploma through Schoology during Advisory on **January 3 (right after we return from break)**. It is critical that ALL seniors complete the form via the website <https://goo.gl/forms/Djo8JAiB3neBst0g2>. **ALL seniors also need to check their name in StudentVUE as this is how it will appear on their diploma. If there is an error they need to bring proof of their correct name to our registrar in the main office as soon as possible so it can be corrected. Please discuss this with your senior before the date they will be completing the form. Once the order is placed, no changes can be made.** More information about the distribution of the cap & gown will be available in the special Graduation Flier which will be handed out in May.

All seniors are required to attend a mandatory senior assembly which will give details on all aspects of graduation requirements and commencement participation. Currently enrolled seniors will attend the assembly in the auditorium on May 30. We will be on an Assembly Schedule with Advisory during the Assembly time starting at 1:20 PM.

COMMENCEMENT PARTICIPATION FEE

The School Board has approved the assessment of \$20.00 for all students participating in commencement. This fee will be collected in April. Students will receive more information about this in the coming months during Advisory.

CLARIFICATION ON GRADUATING WITH HONORS

Seniors third trimester grades and second semester PSEO grades are not used in tabulating graduation honors. Therefore, third trimester grades are not included in final GPA calculation for honors recognition. Honors (a GPA of 3.0 – 3.799) and High Honors (a GPA of 3.8 and above) will be determined soon after second trimester grades have been submitted. Also, GPA calculations are never rounded up in the awarding of academic honors (honor rolls, seniors honors, academic lettering, etc.). In April, a list of seniors eligible to graduate with honors will be generated. In May, those students will receive a notice stating the dates, times, prices and which honor accessories they are eligible to purchase if they so chose. The honors items will be sold in the main office.

PSEO students – please be sure you watch for the information you need for graduation. All information regarding graduation is available on-line. In addition, all information distributed through Advisory is posted on the Virtual Advisory internet site (there is a link on Osseo Senior High's home page). Please be sure to access the site every week for new and updated information.

SENIOR ALL NIGHT PARTY PLANNING HAS BEGUN - PARENTS, WE NEED YOU!

Parents are hard at work planning the Senior All Night Party. The party is Saturday, June 8, following graduation. Parents of ALL seniors are needed to help with the planning of this great party. It takes everyone's help to make this party a success! If you would like to sign up to help or get more information call Tracy Hanson in the main office at the school at (763) 391-8500 (press 0).

Fliers are available in the main office. The form is also on the next page. Registration is going on now. You can mail your registration and check to the address on the flier or drop it off at the Main Office. The cost is \$75 through December 31. On January 1 it goes up to \$85 which will be the price through June 7. Register NOW to get the lowest price possible. All seniors need to be registered by June 7 in order to guarantee they receive a gift bag at the party. The cost at the door is \$95 CASH only.

A REMINDER ABOUT PICKING YOUR STUDENT UP DURING THE SCHOOL DAY

If you need to take your student out during the school day it is very helpful if you can send a note with them in the morning. They should take the note to the attendance staff (in the Information Booth in the Main Lobby). They will be given a pass to leave at the appropriate time and given instructions on how and where to sign out. They will then be able to leave without you having to come in to sign them out.

In the event of an unexpected appointment you may leave a message on the attendance line but it must be at least 30 minutes prior to your coming in to sign them out. When you do come in, please be sure to bring an ID. Thanks!

HEALTH SCIENCE MAGNET PROGRAM

This year's Opportunities in Emergency Care students spent five days putting their emergency care skills to the test. They were at camp for five days of games, classes, demonstrations, competitions, speakers, team building and leadership training. Camp is designed for students studying emergency careers. Report cards are available online approximately two weeks after the end of each trimester. Grades can be checked through ParentVUE. You will need to print this if you need a copy for your records. The information remains on the system until mid-June when students are advanced to the next grade level but we recommend printing each trimester as grades become available.
