They also offer the **Youth Career Awareness Program** - a six week paid summer camp filled with career exploration, field trips, and college-readiness courses. A **\$20,000** scholarship plus additional financial support are offered to students who complete the camp and attend Dunwoody in the fall. - **BROOKLYNK: Get Work Ready Training! Paid Summer Internships!** Work Ready Training: Learn real skills for a real summer job! The trainings will be fun, led by local professionals, and focus on topics such as Networking, Resume Building and Professionalism. Youth between the ages of 14-21 are eligible to apply. The mission of BrookLynk is to prepare youth with essential job skills, experiential employment opportunities, and professional social networks to develop personal pathways to college and career.
